The course belonging to the general knowledge part of the Major in International Trade and Business Law is a foundation course for students to continue studying other courses, such as: Law governing international trade in goods; Law governing international trade in services; Intellectual property rights in international trade for businesses; International Investment Law; The WTO's trade remedies; ...
